

(All active JBers are encouraged to apply!) Plenary is required for LJRs if they are in attendance, if not, a proxy must fill in for them.

- **Project Committee (ProCo)**
- **National Junior Representative (NJR)**

TRANSPORTATION/COSTS

TRANSPORTATION

- LJRs are heavily encouraged to come. NJBM is one of the best ways to meet fellow LJRs across the US as well as learn more about national positions and how to better your JB back home!
- Before registering you should contact your adult board to ensure they will cover transportation cost. We encourage local chapters to fund at least one JBer for this conference.
- For individuals living farther than 5 hours away, flights can be taken and will arrive at the Chattanooga airport (CHA), and transportation will be provided to the campsite from there

COSTS

- All attendees are required to pay \$200 for the weekend (barring early bird August 2-15). This fee will cover supplies and other accommodations. There is also scholarship that will be awarded to multiple JBers which will cover their expenses for NJBM.
- There will be an option in the registration form to add more money to your final cost in order to add more money for the scholarship fund!
